

About WPL

Women Political Leaders (WPL) is the global non-partisan network of women politicians. With members in over 130 countries, WPL aims to increase both the number and the influence of women in political leadership.

The WPL Summit is the world's foremost gathering of women political leaders, having convened over 2,500 Parliamentarians and 40+ women Presidents and Prime Ministers.

Past WPL Summits have been co-hosted in Belgium, Ethiopia, Greece, Iceland, Japan, Jordan, Lithuania, Mexico, Rwanda, and the European Parliament.



Fun facts about Montenegro

Ksenija Petrović Njegoš was considered a highly educated, intelligent, and talented woman. She was born on April 22, 1881, in Cetinje. She is remembered as the first woman in the Balkans to drive a car and the only princess who practiced photography.

Montenegro declared itself an ecological state on September 20, 1991, by adopting the Declaration on the Ecological State in Žabljak. This date is significant because Montenegro became the first country in the world to formally commit to this obligation.

A Country with "Black Mountain"

The name Montenegro means "Black Mountain" in Italian, referring to the dark, dense forests that once covered Mount Lovćen.

Despite its small size, Montenegro is incredibly diverse - you can drive from snowy mountains to sunny beaches in under two hours.

The Bay of Kotor is one of the most stunning coastal areas in Europe, often compared to Norway's fjords.

The Tara River Canyon is the deepest in Europe and second deepest in the world after the Grand Canyon. It's part of Durmitor National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Near the town of Bar, there's an olive tree over 2,000 years old - and it still bears fruit

Montenegro has four UNESCO World Heritage Sites, including the natural and cultural-historical region of Kotor and the Durmitor National Park.

Velika plaža (The Long Beach) in Ulcinj stretches for 13 km, making it the longest beach on the eastern Adriatic coast.

Lake Skadar - A Birdwatcher's Paradise Shared with Albania, Lake Skadar is the largest lake in the Balkans and home to over 270 species of birds, including rare pelicans.


For such a small country, Montenegro has an impressive five national parks: Durmitor, Biogradska Gora, Lovćen, Skadar Lake, and Prokletije.

Biogradska Gora - One of Europe's Last Rainforests

This national park contains one of the last three remaining primeval rainforests in Europe, untouched for thousands of years.

Island Church Built on a Rock - Our Lady of the Rocks

In the Bay of Kotor, there's a tiny artificial island with a church built in 1630, created by sinking old ships filled with stones.

















































































































































